Evidencing your premises payments

We have received queries from practices who are worried that continuing rates of rent reimbursement/subsidies which they receive will not be continuing from July and they believe they have no written evidence of these current rates.

The LMC have asked CCGs to produce schedules as a starting point to consolidate and agree the situation before responsibilities are handed over to NHSE.

Children aged 5 to 11 years can now obtain an NHS COVID Pass letter for international travel

Children aged 5 to 11 years living in England, Wales or the Isle of Man who have had a full primary course of COVID-19 vaccination can now get an NHS COVID Pass letter for travel.

A person with legal responsibility for the child can request the letter on their behalf either online at nhs.uk or by calling the 119 service. The letter is not available via GP practices.

The letter is posted to the address on the child's NHS record and will show all the COVID-19 vaccinations they have received. Further details can be found on the <u>GOV.UK guidance pages.</u>

Accelerating patient access to their GP-held records

General practices were previously informed that from April there will be system changes for all practices using TPP and EMIS systems to provide all patients with easy access to their future health records. GPs will be informed of the go-live date (now expected summer 2022) with 2 months' notice and provided with resources to support preparations.

Educational sessions have been held to support staff with this change. Over 40% of practices have already attended at least one webinar, with further places available throughout May and June.

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Pay Transparency Arrangements

Last year, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care confirmed that the implementation of general practice pay transparency was delayed until 2022. Amendments to the GP Contract Regulations have now come in to force which remove the requirement for individuals within scope of the general practice pay transparency provisions (GMS Regulation 27A, PMS Regulation 21A, AMPS Direction 7A) to make a self-declaration of their 2020/21 NHS earnings by 30 April 2022.

Individuals within scope of the pay transparency provisions should therefore not take any action ahead of 30 April 2022, and commissioners should not seek to enforce this contractual requirement. As previously communicated, commissioners should also continue to not enforce the requirement for individuals within scope of the pay transparency provisions to have declared their 2019/20 NHS earnings by 12 November 2021. These amendments implement the delay that the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care confirmed last year and are made with the expectation that this policy will resume at a later date.

Recruiting GP Clinical Teaching Fellows Lancaster University Medical School

To support the continuing expansion of Lancaster Medical School, they are in the next round of recruiting additional GP Clinical Teaching Fellows to support the higher student numbers due to enter Year 3, 4 and 5 in the next academic year September 22-23. They have a well-established and growing Primary Care Academic Team at LMS, with significant input throughout the undergraduate course from GP tutors — a great positive influence which has contributed to being high in the national metrics for proportion of graduates choosing general practice as a career, and significantly also staying locally.
