# **Managing Extreme Workload Pressures**

The current pressures on General Practice are extreme, and GPs are being faced with unmanageable, unsafe workloads. Therefore, the LMC have issued the <u>attached</u> guidance as we have been receiving requests from constituents asking what practices can do within their contract to try and safely manage patient care.

Please read this guidance to ensure your patients, staff, and contract are protected and this advice is followed correctly.

# Partnership Agreement Drafting Service

Having an up-to-date partnership agreement in place protects you as an individual and your practice, identifying responsibilities and obligations of partners at a practice. It is a vitally important document which should be agreed in advance with any incoming partner.

# LSCFT – EMIS Viewer

An update was shared via a recent Lancashire & South Cumbria ICB GP Newsletter regarding EMIS Viewer. The update advised practices that LSCFT have completed procurement of EMIS Viewer to support clinicians working across admission avoidance services to view the GP record. This is view only access and no records will be added. To do this a data sharing agreement has been completed and each practice will need to activate the agreement through EMIS to allow information in the GP record to be viewed.

It is the LMC's understanding that the Data Protection Officer for Lancashire & South Cumbria GP practices is reviewing the detail of the agreement in order to provide advice across the board, but should you have any queries about this for your practice they can be contacted directly via <u>Mlcsu.ig@nhs.net</u>.
