AI in General Practice

Following a series of announcements generate a renewed focus on the role of AI in general practice, GPC has developed <u>this brief note</u> ahead of more substantial guidance aimed at supporting practices to meet their regulatory obligations. GPC will share a more detailed document in time.

Diagnosing breast cancer in Black women -e-learning module

A new <u>30-minute-learning module</u>, developed by NHS England's Health care Inequalities Improvement Programme and the Royal College of General Practitioners, informs GPs about the experiences of Black women with breast cancer.

The course explores the specific risk factors, challenges related to timely diagnosis, and the lived experience of Black women during the diagnosis process. It also addresses the social and cultural barriers to health care, using case studies to support GPs develop culturally sensitive and effective approaches to care.

NHS cervical screening programme webinar

Taking place on 12 June 2025 from 12pm-1pm, the NHS cervical screening programme webinar will cover changes in respect of screening intervals for the 25-49 year cohort, digitalisation of invitation and result letters, HPV self-sampling, the transgender and non-binary opt-in workforce, as well as general updates from the Cervical Screening Administration Service (CSAS).
