

Responsibility for Prophylactic Prescribing in Public Health Cases

There seems to be a lot of confusion about what GPs are actually contracted to do. This confusion seems to equate (at least to some non-GP HCPs) into a default "get GP to do". If GPs and their colleagues in General Practice had to action all the things that are requested of them daily, I don't think even working 7 days a week would be enough. Its so frustrating and so very demoralising to have the same arguments all day everyday – especially when on call. Most of you will agree that we didn't become GPs so that we could / would need to argue with colleagues about what is and isn't our responsibility.

The main issue is that we are too nice. We are too obliging. We have soaked up a tremendous amount of work on behalf of the "system" in the name of the patient. The saturation point has been reached and we are now finding that our "niceness" is being used against us. Last year I wrote about the term "Pavlov GPs" see brieflet here - and I feel this is truer now than ever.

My point in mentioning all this is that I have lost count of the number of times that I am having to explain to "system" colleagues (at various levels) what is part of "core GP responsibilities". But if some of us don't know what we should and shouldn't be doing then that can be confusing for people not in General

Practice – as they will assume that the person pushing back on the neverending workload dump is simply being "difficult".

Now for the useful bit:

The LMC wishes to highlight that the provision of prophylactic medication in public health emergencies does not form part of the core GMS contract. Public health interventions, including prescribing prophylactic antibiotics following meningococcal disease exposure, are targeted at wider population health, and are typically managed through a coordinated public health response.

GPs may participate in public health efforts through specific service agreements, but such tasks do not fall under the core GMS framework unless separately commissioned. Public health prescribing, such as for meningococcal disease contacts, traditionally falls outside the GMS scope and is managed by public health authorities.

Prophylactic prescribing is an integral part of public health management, and the responsibility for such prescriptions lies with public health bodies, not GPs, unless an explicit local enhanced service arrangement (LES) is in place. Whilst it may be the case that the UKHSA does not have a prescriber within its team to issue prescriptions directly, this should not automatically shift the responsibility to GPs under their GMS contracts.

Please do not feel pressured into accepting responsibility of any workload shift that you are not comfortable with. When in doubt run it past the <u>LMC exec leads</u> who, as always, are here to support you. Thank you.
