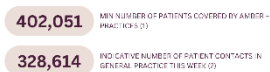


GENERAL PRACTICE ALERT STATE SITREP | 28.03.2025

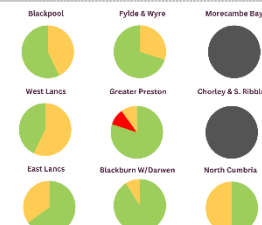

Eid Mubarak

On this joyous occasion of Eid, we would like to extend our warmest wishes to you and your families who are celebrating. May this Eid bring you good health, happiness, and prosperity. As we celebrate, let us remember the values of compassion, unity, and care for one another.

Decommissioning of LES (Lancashire and South Cumbria only)

This is a reminder that as part of the ICBs review of LIS/LES arrangements across Lancashire and South Cumbria, the ICB have taken the decision to decommission a number of existing LES that are inconsistently commissioned across the patch.

As per the dates provided on each of the letters to clarify the decommissioning, we would advise that all practices cease to do the work associated with these as you will no longer be being paid for this. This is in line with our guidance on no longer conceding unfunded work.

In addition to this we have learned that EMS+ is no longer part of the funding arrangement for 2025/26 and as such practices will no longer be required to make use of this or any other reporting system proposed by the ICB. We would, however, continue to encourage practices to engage with the LMC's GPAS enquiries - this confidential data collection enables us to evidence to system partners the pressures within General Practice across the patch.

The LMC are doing further work on supporting practices with the decommissioning of the LES as we understand this will have implications on cash flow, staffing and other organisational challenges. Unfortunately, the ICB have not provided sufficient engagement or notice for these services, as such we are engaging with the ICB on what mitigations they will provide to these lost services and importantly getting clarity on where patients will be directed for services no longer provided in General Practice. We will also be highlighting that it is essential they take responsibility for informing the public about these changes to service provision to prevent GPs from being unfairly blamed for decisions that are entirely out of their control.

LES 25/26 - North Cumbria Only

The LMC recently sent a letter to practices outlining our serious concerns regarding the Non-Meds LES and the broader lack of commissioned services for primary care in North Cumbria. We made it clear that the current offer does not adequately fund the work being asked of practices, and we strongly advised against signing up until the offer improves significantly.

In addition, we have formally written to the ICB to object to the inadequate funding of the Non-Meds LES and to highlight the absence of a commissioned Medicines LES with clear funding specifications. Despite raising these urgent concerns, we have yet to receive a response from the ICB.
