

MHRA Yellow Card reports directly from EMIS

Prescribing tip for information



A MHRA yellow card report for an adverse drug reaction can now be made straight from the patient's EMIS record.

The new [Enhanced Service Specification](#) for the **COVID-19 vaccination programme 2020/21** requires that GP practices will be responsible for recording adverse events to the new COVID vaccines and providing the patient with information on the process to follow if they experience an adverse event in the future after leaving the vaccination site, including signposting the Yellow Card service.

1. **How to report on EMIS**

On the ribbon, click Patient Actions, and then select Yellow Card.

2. **Previous Reports**

Click Add to begin.

3. **Suspected Drugs**

In the Suspected Drugs/Vaccines section, click Add and enter the appropriate details.

4. **Suspected Reaction**

In the Suspected Reactions section, click Add and enter the appropriate details.

The clinician can then add details of the suspected reaction, any other recent medication, and a brief history.
