World Antimicrobial Awareness Week and European Antibiotic Awareness Day 2021

This week (18th – 24th November 2021) marks the launch of the 2021 World Antimicrobial Awareness Week (WAAW). This campaign, led by the World Health Organisation (WHO) is celebrated annually and aims to increase awareness of global antimicrobial resistance and to encourage best practices among the general public, health workers and policy makers to avoid the further emergence and spread of antibiotic resistant infections. European Antibiotic Awareness Day (EAAD) takes place on the 18th November.

The WHO's current slogan for WAAW is 'Antimicrobials: handle with care' and is applicable to all sectors. The theme for the human health sector for WAAW 2021 is 'Spread Awareness, Stop Resistance'.
