**How to Access the Medicines Optimisation Team
Prescriber Training Webinars.**

The Medicines Optimisation Team training webinars have been included in the Primary Care Quality Contract again this year. All prescribers including long term locums and NMPS are required to complete at least 2 training webinars produced by the Medicines Optimisation Team (MOT).

The sessions from last year have now been refreshed and updated and will be re-instated for anyone who did not complete them, and some new webinars will also be added throughout the year. These will include the following topics

- Prescribing of prophylactic antibiotics
- Anticholinergic burden
- Deprescribing and structured medication reviews
- Prescribing of DOAC's/warfarin

Updates will be sent out when these are available to view.

Please note, if the 'Opioids' training webinar was not completed during 2019 – 2020, it is mandatory that this should be included as one of the two to be completed by all prescribers during 2020 - 2021.
