## World Antimicrobial Awareness Week (18<sup>th</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup> November) and European Antibiotic Awareness day (18<sup>th</sup> November)



World Antimicrobial Awareness Week (WAAW) and European Antibiotic Awareness Day (EAAD) takes place every year and are public health initiatives aimed at encouraging responsible use of antibiotics in order to tackle the global issue of antibiotic resistance.

WAAW, EAAD and Antibiotic Guardian (a campaign led by Public Health England) support the aims of the [UK 5 year Action Plan for Antimicrobial Resistance 2019 - 2024](#) and the [UK 20 Year Vision for Antimicrobial Resistance](#), which sets out actions to slow the development and spread of antimicrobial resistance.

The COVID-19 pandemic has presented numerous additional challenges when managing patients with infections. Now, more than ever raising awareness of the risks of antimicrobial resistance remains important as healthcare professionals continue to work together to prevent serious infections – including COVID-19 as well as reducing inappropriate antibiotic use.

With the ongoing challenge of responding to the COVID-19 pandemic, if healthcare professionals can only carry out two simple actions during WAAW the following is recommended:
