NON-FATAL STRANGULATION & SUFFOCATION

Non-fatal strangulation is a serious safeguarding concern that occurs in a variety of contexts:

- Physical altercations from incidents among children on playgrounds to violence within the night-time economy.
- **Sexual strangulation** increasingly normalised and promoted through social media, with growing prevalence among young people.
- **Domestic abuse** significantly increasing the risk to victims when used as part of a pattern of coercive and controlling behaviour.

This partnership initiative aims to:

- Raise awareness of the dangers and potential consequences of strangulation.
- Influence policy and procedural changes in agency responses.
- Dispel myths surrounding so-called "safe" strangulation.
